Kingston, Friends of the Avenue

Tree Update - the replacement trees, planted in September, are doing really well, despite the dry and challenging season. Matthew Daniel, Senior Arborist with Hepburn Shire Council, is constantly monitoring the whole Avenue, especially the new trees which are being watered regularly. The regime centres around extreme weather events. In fact, Matthew worked on Australia Day to ensure the trees were hydrated.

The mulch height around the new trees is slightly exaggerated. When the rain comes, Council will apply liquid microbial treatment that will readily decompose the mulch.

Council was successful in acquiring a Victorian Sustainability Grant to remediate soil health in specific locations throughout the Shire. As part of this grant, nine new trees were selected for a scientific trial, along with ten mature Avenue trees in decline. The mature trees have indication tape, with four as control trees and six as application trees. Council is using FOGO (Food Organics Garden Organics) material to increase the soil's biological activity to aid tree establishment and mature tree longevity.

On one of those delightful summer days – not too hot and definitely not too cold, Friends of Park Lake met at the beginning of February for its first working bee of 2025. This was followed by a delicious picnic to welcome back members and supporters for 2025, including Councillors Shirley Cornish and Pat Hockey, as well as members from the local Land Care Group.

President Maria Marco, reported that so much had been achieved in 2024 including, the completion of the Lion's Club maze, with great help from Ballarat Grammar students, the ongoing enjoyment of events such as the Winter Solstice Festival (which will be held again this year on Saturday, 21 June), the bonfire night, production of greeting cards to raise money to purchase plants and the ongoing planting around the lake.

'This year our focus will be to continue planting around Park Lake, including a lovely garden around the magnolia tree, and we will continue the work on the old fernery section. Friends of Park Lake are a group of like-minded people living in Creswick, who like to get together to improve Park Lake, which has a wonderful history and deserves to be restored. 100 Years Ago

3 March, 1925

LOYAL SPRING HILL LODGE, I.O.O.F. The fortnightly meeting of the above will be held in the Rechabite Hall, This (Tuesday) Evening, at 7.30 o'clock. A full attendance requested. H. Bowley, Secretary.

6 March, 1925

Shopkeepers are notified by advertisement in another column that, under the Factories Act, shops must be registered with the Secretary for Labor before the 14th inst. The penalty for non compliance is £15.

10 March, 1925

T. Kennedy, Hairdresser, of Allendale, will visit Smeaton on the first Thursday of each month (Sale Day), at the Cumberland Hotel. Best attention given. Everything clean. Charges moderate.

13 March, 1925

The annual demonstration of the Country Fire Brigades was commenced on Tuesday, at Warrnambool, when the review and march past took place. The discipline awards were made, and it is pleasing to note that the Creswick Brigade shared in the honors. In D grade they tied for third place, gaining 87 points.

17 March, 1925

The annual St. Patrick's Day Races and Sports took place at Blampied, in Mrs. LaFranchi's paddock, last Saturday afternoon. They were the most successful held for some years past, the races being much more interesting and the attendance very satisfactory.

20 March, 1925

Harvest festival services will be conducted next Sunday morning and evening in St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, Creswick and in the afternoon at Scrub Hill, the preacher being the Rev. S. A. Eastman. Gifts of fruit, vegetables and produce will be received at each church on Saturday afternoon.

24 March, 1925

Visitors to the Botanical gardens should be careful, as on Friday afternoon, when a resident was proceeding to the State Plantation, on the occasion of the public function, a small reddish brown snake of a little more than a foot in length was seen basking in the sunshine on the footpath about 40 yards to the east of the fernery.

27 March, 1925

As announced, the Gem Economic Store, at the corner of Albert and Raglan Streets, Creswick, was opened yesterday with a large display of Lam-Knit knitted goods for men, women and children. It is a fine example of what can be done in Australia, and is well worth an inspection.

31 March, 1925

The trustees of the Creswick Victory Brass Band, which recently decided to disband, met on Saturday evening, when there were present Sir Alexander Peacock and Messrs W. P. Northcott and Alex Broom. The town clerk (Mr. Arthur B. Grose) was appointed secretary to the trustees. As it will be necessary for the trustees to take charge of all instruments, it was decided to meet again next Saturday evening, and to ask the secretary of the band to attend.

Creswick Essential Bags Initiative

Throughout 2024, members of Creswick Essential Bags Initiative (CEBI) distributed hundreds of personal care items to local charities and schools. Demand for items including sanitary products, shampoo and toothpaste, has increased in 2025, with families and individuals struggling to make ends meet.

The group operates under the auspices of Creswick Neighbourhood Centre, receiving donations of goods from the public. A collection box is available at the Centre in Victoria Street. CEBI is able to purchase new products at discounted prices through the generous support of Community Bank Creswick & District, Lions Club Creswick, and North Creswick Car Club.

During March, CEBI members will deliver sanitary products to the Hub for distribution to visitors using public toilet facilities at the library. Toiletries, children's lunch bags with tooth care products and new summer socks will be given to primary schools. Anglicare Creswick, which operates fortnightly community lunches and outreach services, will receive toiletries, towels, and sanitary products.

Over winter, CEBI collects and distributes blankets, warm socks, beanies and scarves to the Shower Bus and Anglicare

for both male and female clients. In spring, Share The Dignity bags are packed tight with personal care and gift products for women who are homeless or escaping domestic violence.

The generosity of the community ensures the success of the CEBI project. New, unopened toiletries may be left at Creswick Neighbourhood Centre. A call-out for blankets and other items will be made before winter.

Resulting from the last Royal Commission into Aged Care, there is now a larger sub committee structure in place. All sub committees are chaired by Board Members and, as President, I am an ex officio member of all sub committees.

Readers may be familiar with the work of the Community Engagement Committee, who are charged with raising the profile of John Curtin Aged Care (JCAC). The Committee is chaired by Sandy Campbell. Its membership is made up of representatives from across the Creswick and Clunes communities and has members who represent the arts, literature, gardening and services, plus Lifestyle Management. They brought you the Cats Art Show, which kicked off the fund raising project for the new bus and the two book sale weekends.

This year, they are facilitating a series of community forums. The first was held in February and addressed *How to get into Aged Care*. It was successfully presented by CEO, Steve Bruechert, and Finance Manager, Simon Coope. JCAC intends it to become an annual activity.

The second forum is to be held in May and will address *How to Cope with Grief/Trauma*. This can significantly impact people's lives: the loss of parents, partners, children, friends, homes, jobs, identities and pets. Often, friends and family feel inadequate when confronted with grief and unintentionally say things that can be hurtful. This is something we will all experience at some stage. This forum will bring together other services and providers already within the community; we will then have a better understanding of where to go for help.

The newest sub committee to be formed is the Consumer Advisory Board and is chaired by Alison Trevenon. The membership of this committee is made up of representatives of management, residents and families and they will look at many aspects of life within the facility with a view to acknowledging or improving the overall amenity of John Curtin Aged Care as a premium service to communities.
